

Checking Web Server Log Settings

Institutional Web Support Services uses log information from your web servers to analyze important marketing information about the web traffic on your unit or department website.

As a system administrator, please make sure that your department or units have the most accurate log analysis data, by checking see if your settings have the following extended logging properties set.

In the IIS Extended Logging Properties of W3C enable the following items:

- * Date (date)
- * Time (time)
- * Client IP Address (c-ip)
- * User Name (cs-username)
- * Server Name (s-computername)
- * Server IP Address (s-ip)
- * Method (cd-method)
- * URI Stem (cs-uri-stem)
- * URI Query (cs-uri-query)
- * Protocol Status (sc-status)
- * Bytes Sent (sc-bytes)
- * Bytes Received (cs-bytes)
- * Time Taken (time-taken)
- * Protocol Version (cs-version)
- * Host (cs-host)
- * User Agent (cs(User-Agent))
- * Cookie (cs(Cookie))
- * Referer (cs(Referer))

By default, many of these are not turned on in either IIS 4.0, 5.0, 5.1 or 6.0
